I do Certify that Obediah Capps Bombardier in my Company of Colo. Marshalls [Thomas Marshall R16059] Regiment Art'y has served the term of three years for which he was enlisted [illegible] and faithful soldier Given under my hand this seventh[?] of Feby[?] 1780

[The following are from [rejected claims in the Library of Virginia](#). The online file also contains records pertaining to Mielte Baptis Cardinal VAS2881.]

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia State Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of Ap 17[??], in the name of Obediah Capps as a Bomb. Artillery for £79.3.– which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Capt. Roane [sic: Christopher Roane X635]

Given under my hand at the Auditor's Office, Richmond, this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of December  
1832. J E. Heath AUDITOR.

[The following apparently pertain to a different soldier named Obediah Capps. The relevance of the last item is not entirely clear.]

I Certify that I was well acquainted with Obed Capps who was a private in Capt'n. Grimes [sic: William Grimes VAS1713] Company of the Continental line of the Revolutionary war and in the fifteenth Regiment and he served three years in succession and untill the end of the war and he was honourably discharged as Witness my hand and seal this the 29<sup>th</sup> October in the year 1832

Princess Ann County to Wit

This day William Cannon [VAS2879] appeared before me a Justice of the peace for the aforesaid County and made oath to the truth of the above statement

given under my hand and seal this the 29<sup>th</sup> day of October in the year 1832

At a Quarterly Session Court held for Princess Anne County the 6<sup>th</sup> day of August 1832. The Court Certify that William Dougo, Frances Ayres [Francis Ayres?], Thomas Bonney [S6688], William Cannon and Malachi Carrol [Malachi Carroll S8180] are persons of respectability.
