I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June 0.786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

Fredericksburg May 16th 1783

The Bearer John Proctor who Enlisted the 6th day of February 1779 for the Term of three years having served the full Term for which he engaged is hereby discharged. Given under my hand S/ A. Buford, Colonel 11th C. R. A Copy S/ J. Pendleton, Junior

Paid to the Bearer the amount of my pay from the first day of January 1780 2 first day of February 1782 and all other accounts that I am justly entitled to including the depreciation and likewise. July 7th 1783 S/ John Proctor

Witness John Hartley To whom it may concern (Copy S/ B. Stark)
