This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 22nd day of April 1784 the name of Charles Bailey as a Soldier of Infantry for £19.16.10, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Capt McGhee and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 20th day of June 1783, in the name of John Bailey [VAS2340] as a Soldier of Infantry for £50.11.7, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Mr Hawkins and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 25th day of July 1783, in the name of Thomas Barnes as a Soldier of Infantry for £24.8.0, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Carpenter and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.

I Anslem Bailey Jr[?] [Ansolem Bailey S37702] make the following statement on oath that John Bailey enlisted in the army of the United States in the year 1776 during the war and served in a regiment commanded by Gen'l. Mulenburg [sic: Peter Muhlenberg BLWt1495-850], and died at Bethlehem Hospital after having served for three years, as a common soldier.

That Charles Bailey enlisted in the army of the United States in the year 1777 for three years, served in a regiment commanded by General Mulenburg, and having served two years, died in service, at the Valley Ford [sic: Valley Forge].

That Thomas Barnes inlisted in the service of the United States in the year 1776 for three years, served as an orderly sergent in the first Virginia regiment, in a company commanded by Capt. Abner Crump [R13459], and a regiment commanded by Col. George Gibson [BLWt1985-500] and served out his time.

That Anslem Bailey for Nancy Bailey, John Bailey, Tabitha Gilliam wife of William Gilliam, Parke Bailey, Lucy Boswell wife of John Boswell and Wm. Bailey are the Heirs and distributees of the said John Bailey, and Charles Bailey, and that the said Anslem, Nancy, John, Tabitha, Parke, and Lucy are the Heirs and distributees of the said Thomas Barnes. That Anslem Bailey served in the said company and regiment with the said Thomas Barnes. Given under my hand and seal this the 15th day of March in the year 1833.
