Culpeper County Towit

Mason Colvin [possibly S9198] made oath before me William Broadus one of the Justices for said county that he has a Brother by the name of Elkin Colvin who enlisted as a soldier in the Indian war in the year 1758 or 59 under (he thinks, a Cap'n Blag – that his said Brother died in said service and he the said Mason is the Eldest Brother of the said Elkin and that he has never received any Land for said services or authorised any person to do so – the term of his inlistment was during the war  
Given under my hand this 20<sup>th</sup> Oct'r 1811. Will Broadus

NOTE: There was no provision for bounty land for service in the French and Indian War.
