Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Petition for bounty land

Wm Purcell (or Pursley) Soldier -Ills Regt.

One of the pay rolls of Captain Ro. George's [Robert George's] Company of artillery belonging to the Illinois Regiment (see volume I Illinois Papers) shows that William Purcell, or Pursley, enlisted April 14<sup>th</sup> 1780 for the war & was in service & receiving pay January 31<sup>st</sup> 1783 – other pay roll show him in service at different times.

This claim has been reported by me as good for a service of three years in the Illinois list – No. 4 – I [indecipherable word] now to [indecipherable word] that Report – by reporting William Purcell, or Pursley, entitled to land, for a service for & during the war, under an enlistment prior to April first 1781.
