


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

The Deposition of Jno. Drummond [possibly John Drummond S8376] of the County of Accomac [sic: Accomack] aged Eightey Seven years being first duly sworn Deposeth and Sayeth that he was well acquainted with Charles Cooper that was Insine [sic: Ensign] in Capt. Jno. Croppers [John Cropper W3781] Company attached to the 9th Regiment in Continenton Establishment, why I recolet this my brother James Drummond was lutenent In the said Company whome marched with the Regiment and Died in Philladelphia and this Deponat was allso well Acquainted with Danniell Lewiss [possibly Daniel Lewis VAS903] Seaman that was First in the Galley Comanded by Captn. Wattson [sic: Johannes Watson VAS2458] untill the said Galley was lade up and afterwards went on bord of the Libirtey Comanded by Captn. Britan [possibly John Britain (Britton) R13, Sailing Master on the *Liberty*] and he wll ways understood that he served to the end of the war and was Regularly Discharged and farther this Deponant sayeth not
