## Pension application of Thomas Olphin VAS338 Transcribed by Will Graves

Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

## [From rejected pension records in the Library of Virginia]

City of Richmond to wit

This day William Gentry<sup>1</sup> of King William County and State of Virginia appeared before me and Alderman for the City aforesaid & having been first duly sworn by me on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God deposes and saith. That he is now nearly seventy-five years of age. That he was a Soulder [Soldier] in the Revolutionary War & served under the command of Colonel Charles Harrison & Edward Carrington & was in the Artillery at the battles of Monmouth [June 28, 1778], Gates defeat [August 15-16, 1780] and other service. That he was well acquainted with Thomas Olphin now dead formerly of Hanover County & recollects that he was a Soldier in the same Regiment of artillery in which this Affiant served, that he knew said Olphin before he went into service & though he does not know when he enlisted yet he distinctly recollects that he found said Olphin in service when he joined the Regiment & knows he served as a private. Thinks that he served fully three years. This affiant served within one month of three years himself & found said Olphin in service when he went in. Given from under my hand this 9<sup>th</sup> of September 1831
