Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I do hereby certify that Selby Onions was a soldier in my company of the 9th Virginia Regiment in the service of the United States that he was taken prisoner at the battle of German Town [Germantown October 4, 1777] and died in Philadelphia New Jail in the latter part of the year 1777 or the beginning of the year 1778, and that he was a faithful Soldier as far as of my knowledge and by the character given to him by other officers.
