Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I do Certify that George Osburne who Entered into the Service of the United States in the 13th Virginia Regiment as a Soldier in the Beginning of the year 1777 was killed by the Indians on the 24th of February 1779 near Fort Laurens while in the same Regiment and in actual Service of the United States. Given under my hand at Fort Pitt
