I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]



Virginia – Prince William County June 1st 1812

I hereby certify that John Gunyon, enlisted in the service, as a minute man (in this State) under Capt. Andrew Leach or Captain Lee, in the year 1775, that in the latter end of the same year, or in the year 1776 he enlisted in said Companies as a Soldier for three years, in the third Virginia Regiment; and that he died to the Northward the last of 1776 or the first of 1777. Given under my hand & seal date above.

By the Books of this Office it does not appear, that any warrant or warrants have issued to Nathaniel Overall or John Gunyon, for their services in the revolutionary war with Great Britain.
