Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I hereby Certify, that in the month of September 1776, By order of the Committee of Safety, I succeeded Colonel Adam Stephens in the Command of the forces ordered to the defense of Portsmouth & Norfolk, and being vested with Power to give such Assistance to Captain Faukner as I might Judge necessary, for carrying on those Fortifications, at & near Norfolk & Portsmouth; I did appoint John Overton Esquire and Engineer which office he took on him shortly after my arrival at the place above mentioned, & whose conduct met with my highest Approbation.

Given under my hand this 22nd Day of March 1800
