

Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to John Garrott VAS3687
Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

[The following are from [rejected claims in the Library of Virginia.](#)]

I David Kinnard [S5557] of the county of Rappahannock state of Virginia at the request of the heirs of John Garrot Dec'd do certify that I knew him well and that the said John Garrot enlisted the service before I did as a soldier for three years in the war of the Revolution in the year of 1776 and was attached to the Reg't commanded by Col. George Gibson [BLWt1985-500]. The said Garrot continued in the service untill he died and was a mess mate of mind. Given under my hand and seal this 19th day of June 1835

I Peter Triplett [Peter H. Triplett W2706] of the County of Culpeper & state of Virginia, at the request of the heirs of Jno Garrot Dec'd do certify that I knew him the said Jno Garrot and that he enlisted in a company commanded by Captain Jno Lee [John Lee VAS871] to which Company I belonged and that we marched in the 1777 from the County of Culpeper to Hampton under the command of Capt. Lee and that the said Garrot served until sometime in the year 1778 when he the said Garrot died
[22 June 1835]

Peter Triplett

Know all men by these presents that I James Garrott son and heir at law of John Garrott, dec'd who was a soldier in the army of the United States and entitled to Land Bounty for a service of three years do hereby constitute and appoint Edmund Broadus my true and Lawful Attorney for me and in my name to receive from the Reg[iste]r of the Land office of Virginia or from any other officer of the State or General Government a warrant or warrants for whatever amount of land may be allowed me on account of the service of the said John Garrott. [The rest not transcribed.]

NOTES: A note in the file also mentions Reuben Garrott, but I did not find any other document pertaining to him. The index card states that the file includes a report by Commissioner John H. Smith, but I did not find the report.
