State Pension Application of Matthew Burk VAS39

Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

[From pension records in the Library of Virginia:]

Agreeable to an order of Berkeley Court to me Directed I have proceeded to examin Matthew Burk a Con'tl [Continental] Soldier who stands upon the List of Pensioners and finds that he has been shot through the Body. I am of opinion that the weakness produced by the wound renders him unable to procure a living by hard labour, and that he is a proper object to stand upon the List of Pensinoners, Given under my hand this.

20th February 1787

Charles [last name illegible] Surg't.

May the 8th 1787 Please to deliver my pension Warrant to Mr. Smith Slaughter & his receipt shall be good against me

Matthew his Xmark Burk

I do hereby Certify that Mathew Burk a Soldier in the 4^{th} Virginia Regiment, was wounded in his shoulder in the Battle of Trenton in the year 1777 [sic: 26 Dec 1776]. And always behaved himself as a good Soldier, and it is my Oppinion in Entitled to the State's Bounty in such Cases.

Given under my hand this 19th July 1787

William Cherry/ late Cap'n. 4th Virg'a. Reg't.

I do with the advice of the Council hereby Certify that Matthew Burk aged about [blank] years, late a private in the 4^{th} Virg'a. Regim't. whose pay was at the rate of £24 pr annum, was wounded in the Service of the United States and that he is allowed the sum of £12 yearly to commence from the first day of January 1786.

Given under my hand as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia at Richm'd. the 22^d. day of October 1787.
