Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I do hereby Certify that James Stewart, Dan Ellis, George Mosely, Harris & Anselm [or Anslem] Gilliam, Nathan Hearn & George Long enlisted as privates for 3 years in the fifteenth Virginia Continental Regiment in the War between England & America and all died in said service except George Long, also George Rose was enlisted in the service of the United States during the war & died in the same. Given under my hand this 2nd day of February 1797
