## Pension application of Alexander Martin VAS496 Transcribed by Will Graves

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

## [From pension records in the Library of Virginia]

At a Court held in Augusta County October 18<sup>th</sup> 1785

Alexander Martin appeared in Court and upon examination it is the Opinion of the Court that he is rendered unable to procure a Sustainance [sic, sustenance] by Labour in consequence of wounds received in the publick service & that he ought to be allowed a pension of 18 pounds per annum, which is ordered to be certified

At a Court held for Augusta County March 27th 1786

Alexander Martin a pensioner proved to the satisfaction of the Court that he received his wounds at the Battle of Guilford in North Carolina March 15, 1781 in Captain Joseph Alexander's Company of Militia from Rockbridge County, he is aged twenty-seven years, resides in this County, & he also produced a Certificate from a surgeon of his inability – &c – which is ordered to be certified

...was wounded at Guilford Battle Under the Command of General Stephenson [probably a mistaken reference to General Edward Stevens] is Rendered Uncapable [sic] of Duty by a Wound which he Received in Right Side viz. the bullet went in & through the [indecipherable words] & out at the [indecipherable words] of the Lower abdomen and notwithstanding all the necessary Precautions of both External & internal Means He is rendered a proper invalid incapable of Duty. His place of residence and hath been at Captain Zachariah Johnston's Delegate in Augusta County Virginia. Given under my hand at Staunton this 21 December 1786

I do, with the advice of Council, hereby certify that Alexander Martin of Augusta, aged about 27 years, late a Private in the Militia of Augusta County appears to have been disabled in such a manner while in the service of the United States as to entitle him to the sum of 15 pounds yearly; which allowance is accordingly made him, to commence on the first day of January 1786
