Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Essex November Court 1787

John Martin son of George Martin a Soldier in the 2<sup>nd</sup> State Regiment – who died in the service which son is maimed by the loss of a hand is recommended to the Executive as a proper Person to be put on the Pension List which is ordered to be certified.

I do with the advice of the Council hereby Certify that John Martin, Orphan of George Martin, deceased, who was a Private in the 2<sup>nd</sup> State Regiment and died in the Service of the Commonwealth, is allowed the sum of six pounds yearly, to commence from the first day of January last.

Given under my hand as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia at Richmond this 6<sup>th</sup> day of December 1787.
