Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." 

Department of War Bounty Land office September 3rd 1833

Sir

I here with return you the Papers containing your application for bounty land from the United States and have to inform you that, it appears by the records of this Office, Land Warrant No. 17m 351 for 100 acres issued on the 31st of December 1791 to Benjamin Mofflin, Assignees he of William Martin, who was a Private of Colonel John Gibson's Regiment Virginia line, and the only Soldier of that name, returned on the records of that Regiment as being entitled to bounty land from the United States.

I William Martin aged 70 years do upon oath testify and declare that I entered the service by enlistment in the year 1777 for the term of during the war in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Gibson of the Virginia line and that I continued in the service aforesaid until the close of the war, when I was regularly discharged from the aforesaid Regiment commanded by Colonel Gibson –

I furthermore declare, that I have never received a warrant for the Land promised to me on the part of the State of Virginia nor have I ever assigned or transferred my claim in any manner whatsoever therefore I request the Register of the Land office of the State of Virginia to issue a warrant for the Land [indecipherable words] State aforesaid and hand the said warrant over to Waldo P. Goff of the Senate of Virginia who is hereby authorized to receive and receipt for the same.
