Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Hereby Certify that Thomas Mason Joined my Quota of Regulars in April 77 & Served 3 years as regular Soldier and afterwards enlisted for the War the said soldier died, left a wife & one children behind him as Certified this 5th of October 1783

I do hereby certify that I knew Thomas Mason to have been a Soldier in the State Service in the years 1777 & 1778 but how long he continued therein I know not.
