## Pension application of John Maypes (Mapes) VAS545 Transcribed by Will Graves

Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." War Department Bounty Land Office June 13<sup>th</sup> 1831

I certify that, it appears from the records in this office, that Land Warrant No. 13.529 4 100 acres issued on the 26 April 1792 in the name of John Mapes, for his services as a Private in Lee's Legion in the War of the Revolution.

I John Mapes (or Maypes) aged eighty years do upon solemn affirmation testify and declare that in the year 1778, I enlisted for the term of "during the War" and served in Regiment No. \_\_\_ Under the command of Colonel Lee [Henry "Light Horse Harry" Lee] of the Virginia Line, and that I continued in the service aforesaid until the close of the war, when I was regularly discharged from the said Regiment commanded by Colonel Lee. — I further declare that I have never received a warrant for the Bounty Land promised to me on the part of the State of Virginia nor have I ever assigned or transferred my claim in any manner whatsoever.

Therefore – Know all men by these presents that I John Mapes, or Maypes, aforesaid do hereby constitute and appoint Cornel Joseph Watson of Washington City, to be my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name to demand and receive from the proper office of the State of Virginia the warrants due me for service to the end of the War in Lees Legion. –

On the 15<sup>th</sup> day of January A.D. 1830 before me the Subscriber one of the Justices of the Peace in and for the County of Gloucester – Personally came James B Cooper<sup>1</sup> who being duly affirmed according to law upon his solemn affirmation saith – that he is a commissioned Officer in the Navy of the United States and served in Lee's Legion of the Virginia Line during the Revolutionary War. And was personally acquainted with John Mapes a Soldier in the first troops of said Legion, who served until the Piece of 1783 and was regularly discharged in the State of South Carolina at the close of the

war - And this affiant further states that after the War, he this affirmant finding that a number of persons were of the name of James Cooper, he this affirmant assumed the letter B in the middle of his name for a distinction. And that he has ever since been known, called & distinguished by the name of James B Cooper.
