## Bounty Land Warrant information relating to John McAllister VAS548 Transcribed by Will Graves vsl 3VA 4/3/13

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

## [From bounty land records in the Library of Virginia]

Robert Russell Senior<sup>1</sup> a Revolutionary Soldier & a person of truth & veracity came before me and made oath that Daniel McAllister enlisted in Captain Blair's Company Virginia line for the term of during the war & served until the Battle of Germantown [October 4, 1777] & was killed in that engagement. Given under my hand & seal as a justice of the peace in & for said County this 21<sup>st</sup> January 1834.

Levin Hyslop<sup>2</sup> a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity made oath before me that he was well acquainted with Daniel McAllister of this County – that he enlisted in Captain Blair's Company for the term of during the War & was killed at the Battle of Germantown in October 1777. Given under my hand & seal as a justice of the peace in & for Accomack County this 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1834

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of December 1785, in the name of Danl. McCalister, as a Soldier of Infantry for £3.10.8, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Colo. Cropper and was given for services prior to the 1<sup>st</sup> January 1782.

Given under my hand, at the Auditor's Office, Richmond, this 6 day of February 1834.
