Bounty Land Warrant information relating to Mahlon Mead VAS622 Transcribed by Will Graves

I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

This are to certify that Mahlon Mead formerly a Soldier in the first Virginia Regiment has duly and faithfully served the Term of three years for which he was enlisted in consequence of which and at his own request he is hereby Discharged from any further service in the Army of the United States & permitted to return to his home free and unmolested having received his Bounty pay and Clothing & Deficiencies of pay and Clothing in full of all allowances and provision made by the Congress for these Troops his receipt for which is on the back hereof. Given under my hand at Philadelphia this the [illegible] day of February 1780
