Bounty Land Warrant information relating to Levin Melson VAS638 Transcribed by Will Graves

I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

I Thomas Cropper of Accomack County aged 68 years do hereby certify & declare that I was personally and intimately acquainted with Levin Melson deceased he and I being raised in the same neighborhood – I do further certify that the said Levin Melson was Carpenter's mate on board the armed vessel called the "*Accomack*" when she was attached to the Virginia State Navy during the Revolutionary War; and I do further certify that Levin Melson served as Carpenter's mate on board of her the whole time she was in service, a period more than three years – In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 29th of September 1830
