Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." This is to Certify that William Miller was a Captain Lieutenant in Harrison's [Charles Harrison's] Artillery 1776 and that he served in the War between the United States & Great Britain from January or February 1776 to the close of the War.

Given under my hand this 18th of June 1799

I do Certify that the within named William Miller was a Cadet in the 7th Virginia Continental Regiment commanded by Colonel William Dangerfield [William Daingerfield]. He entered about the first of April 1776 & continued therein until Colonel Harrison's Regiment of Artillery was raised which was about the winter '76 or spring of 1777 & that he continued therein until the close of the War at which time he ranked as Captain Lieutenant

I do Certify that the within named Whitehead Coleman was appointed an Ensign in Colonel William Daingerfield's Regt. being the 7th Virginia Continental Regiment about April 1776 that he continued there in until Colo. Harrison's Regiment of Artillery was raised which I think was sometime in the winter 1776 or Spring of 1777 and that he was then appointed a Captain Lieutenant in said Harrison's Regiment. He was afterwards promoted to a captaincy & continued in service until the Close of the War
