Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." The deposition of Wm Kenahorn<sup>1</sup> aged Eighty Five

Being first duly Sworn deposeth and saith that he was well acquainted with the following men that he this deponent enlisted in the Company commanded by Captain Levin Joynes in the 9<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment in the Revolutionary War and that they served faithfully together upwards of two years in said Regiment to the North after which some reenlisted and some were taken prisoners and never again saw them. They were the following men

James Bonwell,<sup>2</sup> Coventon Broadwater, Thomas Biggs, John Bull, Jacob Chance, Peter Dolby, Henry Davis (Drummer), Peter Delestation [?], Wm Doe [William Doe<sup>3</sup>], Wm Finny [William Finny]<sup>4</sup>, Elisha Garret, Custis Geddings, Benjamin Johnson, died, John Moore, Thomas Moore,<sup>5</sup> John Million (died), James Rodgers, Garret Toppin, Obadiah White, Robert White Sergeant, James Wallace, Spencer Wise (died) and further this deponent saith not.
