Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I do Certify that William Moffit served as a private soldier in my company of the 3rd Virginia Regiment Continental line from the first day July 1777 until the first day of July 1780 at which time he was discharged he having served the full term of his Enlistment he received his pay in paper Currency up to the 5th December 1779. Given under my hand August 5th 1783
