## Bounty Land Warrant information relating to William Moore VAS744 Transcribed by Will Graves

Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." ## [From bounty land records in the Library of Virginia]

Richmond 15<sup>th</sup> of March 1796

I do hereby certify that Wm Moore was appointed by the Committee of Botetourt County agreeable to an ordinance of Convention a first Lieutenant to a company of regulars which Company I had the Honor to command on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of August 1776 and continued in said service until the 29<sup>th</sup> day of November 1777 when he was killed in a skirmish with the Indians at Point Pleasant on the Ohio [River].

This Company was raised for the defense of the Western Frontiers by the State of Virginia and in October 1776 were by act of Assembly incorporated with other Companies on the Ohio into the 12<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment on Continental Establishment commanded by Colonel James Wood, which incorporation took place the 6<sup>th</sup> of December following from which period they were commanded by Continental officers, were under the same regulations and pay and I do further Certify that the said Moore's Heirs never applied for or obtained a Land Warrant on his behalf as far as I know or believe.
