Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I do certify that Peter More a Soldier in Colonel Posey's [Thomas Posey's] detachment was enlisted for & During the War and that his mother is entitled to the Portion of land allotted to all soldiers of that Duration.
