Pension application of John Morris VAS756 Transcribed by Will Graves vsl 13VA

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

In the House of Delegates

June 9<sup>th</sup> 1783

Resolved that the Petitions of John Morris & Peter Mason Junior praying compensation from the public in consideration of the Wounds which they have received whilst Soldiers in the Service of this State or reasonable, and that the Petitioners be put on the list of pensioners and allowed half pay for life.

On Examining the Bearer here of John Morris who says he was a private in Captain Anderson's [John Anderson's] Company & in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Hawes [Samuel Hawes] – that the wounds he received were at Cambden [Camden, the 2<sup>nd</sup> battle of Camden also known as the battle of Hobkirk Hill, April 25, 1781] – find the left shoulder & arm have been penetrated by two Balls which greatly injured the Bone, pieces of which still continue to come away & the Sores continue Open – his arm may be said to be totally useless as to labor & he says he has no other mode of livelihood – am of Opinion he is fully entitled to whatever Some the law allows a pensioner.

I do, with advice of the Council, hereby certify that John Morris (about 46 years of age) late a Private in the first State Regiment of Virginia appears to have been disabled in such a manner while in the service of the Continental as to entitle him to the Sum of eighteen pounds yearly; which allowance is accordingly made him, to commence from the first day of January 1786.
