Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I do Certify that William Morrison deceased in nude in the Second Virginia Regiment in September 1776 that he continued in said Regiment till September 1779 during which time he served the United States a fairly as a Sergeant and that he was regularly discharged the service at the Expiration of the term he enlisted for.
