[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

Report upon the claim of Charles Lewis – Seaman Charles Lewis Seaman S. N.

Charles Lewis' name is on the Army Register. He received a [indecipherable words] – to wit -£52.12 to settle balance of his full pay as Seaman.

He was regularly enrolled as a Seaman on board the *Dragon*¹ in 1779 [could be 1777] – and probably served on board that vessel during the whole time of her service –

In the printed list of officers & Seaman of the State Navy No. 5 I have reported Charles Lewis entitled to bounty land for a service of three years.

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia State Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 1st day of December 1785, in the name of Charles Lewis, as a sailor for £52.15.6, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Alexander McRoberts and was given for services prior to the 1st January 1782.
