## Pension application of Daniel Lewis VAS903 Transcribed by Will Graves

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

## [From rejected pension records in the Library of Virginia]

I Certify it appears from a list of such of the names of the semen of the Virginia State line as received certificates for the balance of their full pay agreeably to the Act of Assembly passed at the November Session 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of April 1785 in the name of Daniel Lewis for £74.15.6.

Given under my hand at the Auditors Office, this 16<sup>th</sup> day of April 1831 S/ Jas. E. Heath, Aud.

[p 3: Scarborough Bloxsom<sup>1</sup> gave an affidavit regarding this claim, but the image of that affidavit as posted online is illegibly faint – a few words can be discerned, but not enough to warrant transcription. I think I see that Bloxsom states the veteran served upon the Galley Accomack<sup>2</sup> from the time she was laid down to the time she was laid up and dismantled.]
