I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I certify that Mr. Stephen Lewis, son of Mr. Thomas Lewis of Loudoun County, enlisted as a Dragoon in Lieutenant Colonel Lee's [Henry "Light Horse Harry" Lee's] Troop the 20th of July 1776 & served as such until the first of June 1778 when he was appointed a Quarter Master-Sergeant, in this Capacity he served until the 1st of August 1779 when he was appointed a Cornet & served as such until he was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant the 17th of November 1780, & in this last Capacity he served until he died the 11th of October 1781 at Santee in South Carolina.
