At a meeting of the Brigadiers & Field Officers of the Virginia line at Camp Ramapough, September 23, 1779 agreeable to the directions of His Excellency the Commander in Chief, for the purpose of making a proper arrangement of the Officers of the Virginia line

The Officers having had under their consideration as well the proceedings of the Committee of Arrangement at White Plains as the subsequent Resolutions of Congress of the 24th of November 1778, which were in consequence of the report of their Committee, are of the opinion, that all the Officers intitled to a rise, should take it from the time the vacancy happened, without having regard to Officers

who were made Prisoners of War, previous to the commencement at White plains, and have founded their opinion on the following facts: That when the arrangement was made, a full meeting of the general & Field Officers of the Virginia line, were desired by the Committee of Arrangement, to propose some equitable mode of arranging the Officers and doing justice to the Prisoners of War: which Board were then of opinion, that the Prisoners should be considered as Supernumerary until their exchange, but not out of the line: that upon their exchange, they should have the liberty of coming into the line, and that the Junior Officer of the same rank should retire upon the provision of Congress, in order to make room for such prisoner. 2^d. That this plan was approved by the Committee of Arrangement, and they have never understood it was rejected by Congress, but on the contrary they are inclined to think, that the Resolution of Congress of the 24th of November was meant as an improvement of the plan – that it certainly must have been their idea that all vacancies should be filled up, and that upon exchange of prisoners of war, they should be entitled to half pay untill a vacancy happen when they should have a right to come again into the line, with the same rank they would have been intitled to, if they had not been captured — They are further of Opinion that the Board of Officers appointed at Middle Brook in March last, in their proceedings could have no retrospective view, and that their determination only affects such Officers as have been captured subsequent to the Arrangement at White plains; there seems to have been a mistake in the memorandum made by the board at Middle Brook, where they say that all vacancies were left open which in reality was not the case; except in one or two Regiments, the vacancy occasioned by Lieutenant Colonel [Charles] Fleming's resignation could not be filled up at that time, as it was known, agreeable to this opinion they have formed an arrangement, conformable to the spirit of the Resolution of Congress giving Major Cabell and Captain Waggoner rank from the date of Lieutenant Colonel Flemings resignation, as well as all other officers who are, agreeable to this plan, intitled to promotion, which will fully appear by the annexed arrangement.

The Board beg leave to represent that the arrangement of the Officers of the Ninth Regiment is erroneous, and that unless the mistake is rectified, it will be injurious to the Officers of the other Regiments, as the Officers of the Ninth by this arrangement take rank from their appointments, while the others only rank from the time they inlisted their Respective Quotas of men.

The Board beg leave to report that Captain Issaac Israel [Isaac Israel] of the fourth regiment has been absent about sixteen months – that he has been repeatedly called upon to join his Regiment without effect. That he had offered to resign at different times and there was reason to believe that he did not consider himself in the line, and that several other Officers in the line have been long absent – and have failed to join their Regiments or give satisfactory reasons for their absence Wm Woodford Brig Genl/ Peter Muhlenburg B. Besides the aforegoing Arrangement of Field Officers & Captains – (The Captn Lieut's are only regimentally digested in the arrangement of the Board) copied from the Arrangement of Generals Woodford & Muhlenburg &c of the $23^{\rm d}$ of Sept 1779 not transcribed. – they made a Regimental Arrangement at the end of which they subjoined the following memorandum under their signatures.

"Note the Board have thought it necessary to make out a true copy of the State of the whole Arangement of the Virginia line, as made out at White plains in Sept 1778 & at middle Brook in March 1779 in order that the whole may appear at one point of view. They have not undertaken to determine any disputes of rank, or making alterations in the dates heretofore settled – those Officers who are intitled to a rise will appear by the word "promoted" opposite their names, such as have never received their Commissions and marked *"

Dates are when commissions were to take effect.
