Transcribed by Will Graves12/1/16 rev'd 9/1/19[Transcriber's Note: Despite someone at the NC Archives having penciled a note "[1776-Cont.]"at the top of image posted at the site shown above, I'm not at all convinced that this is aRevolutionary War list. I could not find anyone on this list other than a Captain LawrenceThompson who might have been listed on this roster. In his own pension application, Thompsonstates he served in the 1st NC Regiment on the Continental Establishment. He makes noreference to having commanded a Troop of Dragoons. It seems very odd to me that I cannot findany of the other men referred to in any of the resources available to me as having served in theRevolution. Thus, I urge caution in relying on this list as evidence of the service of the menlisted on it as having served in the NC Dragoons during the Revolution. If anyone recognizesany of the names as having served say in the War of 1812 or the Civil War, please let me know. Iran this by J. D. Lewis who thinks the list MIGHT be a 'long lost' roster from the Revolution, butalso he has questions as to when the men listed in the roster served.]

¹ There is a very remote possibility that <u>Lawrence Thompson R10546</u> served in the NC Dragoons during the Revolutionary War. As noted above, however, that Lawrence Thompson made no claim in his application for a pension from the federal government as having served in the NC Dragoons during the Revolution. The possibility remains that this claimant simply elected not to list all his services in his pension application. There are numerous instances of applicants stating only the services needed to qualify for a pension without detailing all their services. That said, I don't believe Lawrence Thompson R10546 is the "Captain Lawrence Thompson" named in the heading of the above roster.
