Know all men present that I James Lyle of the Town of Manchester in the County of Chesterfield & State of Virginia, by virtue of a Power of Attorney by Andrew Maben or Maven, only brother german now in life and nearest of kin to the deceased Captain James Maben or Maven constituting and appointing me his Attorney & Factor as will more fully appear by the copy hereunto annexed. Do hereby constitute and appoint John Davidson of the City of Washington my Agent or Attorney to procure from the Secretary of War or other Officer or Officers of the General Government a Patent for the proportion of Land allotted allotted to James Maben or Maven late a Captain in the Army of the United States, in the name of the said Andrew Maben or Maven heir and Legal Representative of the said deceased James Maben or Maven. And to do all lawful acts requisite for effecting the premises — Hereby ratifying and confirming all that my said Attorney shall do therein by virtue hereof

"Andrew Maben or Maven weaver in Pitlessie in the parish of Cults and Shire of Fife in that part of Great Britain called Scotland only Brother German now in life & nearest of Kin to the deceased Captain James

¹ The file for William Perry R5515 states that he served under Captain James Mabon in the 2nd Virginia Regiment. The file also contains an annotation (apparently by an employee who worked with the files) that James Mabon was 'Lieutenant to Capt. [John] Stokes of the 2nd Va. Regt.' John Stokes [B L Wt. 526-300] lost a hand at Waxhaws (Buford's Defeat) in SC. James Maben could have succeeded him as captain.

Maben or Maven of the State of Virginia formerly Stone mason or brick layer there. Judging it necessary to grant the power under written and having full & entire confidence in the fidelity & integrity of the person after named for executing the same Have therefore made constituted & appointed and by these presents Do make ordain constitute and appoint Mr. James Lyle of the Town of Manchester in the County of Chesterfield & State of Virginia merchant my true & lawful Attorney & Factor & in my name & for my use & behoof to oath demand, sue for, recover & receive from all and every person or persons whom it doth, or may concern all such sum or sums of money debts demands goods chattles means & effects whatsoever real or personal which pertained or belonged or which were due & owing to the said deceased Captain Maven or Mabon my brother german at the time of his decease in any manner or way by any person or persons whatsoever ~"

'... providing and declaring always as it is hereby provided and declared that my said Attorney shall be bound and obliged, as by acceptation hereof he binds & obliges himself to make due compt [?] reconing [sic] and payment to me of all his intromissions [?] in virtue of these presents which are to subsist until recalled by a writing under my hand after a deduction of all his necessary charges & expenses and a suitable gratification for his own trouble; In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal at Edinburg this sixteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & eighty eight years

Do hereby certify and declare that we had occassion, one and all of us to be well acquainted with the now deceased James Mabon or Maven who was brother german of the within named & designed Andrew Maben or Maven in Pitlessie in the said Parish of Cults and Shire of Fife – that after he left Fife which was some time before the American War broke out he went to Midlothian [?] in the Shire of Edinburgh & wrought some time as a Stone Mason or Brick layer and from thence he went to Virginia where he entered into and served in the Military Service of America during the war as a Captain or some other Officer in the american service & died there as we are credibly informed within those few years. and that said Andrew Maben or Maven his brother german is still in life. In testimony whereof we have here unto set our hands & seals this Twenty second day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & eighty eight
