Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

9th November 1808

Capt. James Pendleton was appointed an Ensign in the 7th Virginia Regiment in March 1776 & continued in the Army of the United States to the end of the war, as will appear by the musterrolls. –

It appears by reference to the Register of Warrants in this office that James Pendleton has drawn a warrant for $4666\ 2/3$ acres for his services as a Captain in the Virginia line on Continental Establishment. Certificate states for services from January 1776 to the present day, and is dated the 24^{th} of January 1783.
