[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

[Note: There are no substantive papers in this file. The only papers contained in it are powers of attorney and related items filed by the heirs at law of James W. Green in which they assert that he was reputed to have been a surgeon in the North Carolina Continental line and that he lived in Halifax County, North Carolina at the time he rendered his services. The power of attorney is given by Lucy P. Green of Columbia, SC, widow of Allen Jones Green, late of Columbia, and guardian of Allen J. Green, Halcot P. Green, Lucy J. Green, Frederick L. Green and John S. Green, children and heirs of Allen Jones Green, and Mary C. Izard, an adult daughter and heir at law of Allen Jones Green. They appoint Henry Northrop of Washington City to act as their attorney to obtain whatever bounty land they might be entitled to as heirs of Allen Jones Green, deceased, who as the only child and heir of James W. Green. The power of attorney is dated June 15, 1839 and was filed in Richland District, SC.
