Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

It appears by the Register of the Musters of the 8<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment that William Layland enlisted for during the War, but no evidence of his having served to the end thereof.

William Layland of lawful age, on the holy Evangels [sic] of Almighty God, deposes & saith that he enlisted in the Continental Army for "during the war", that he served faithfully in the same until he was taken a prisoner by the British forces & remained in captivity until the close of the late revolutionary war, and that he never deserted from the Army, nor has ever received or conveyed to anyone the bounty in land promised by the Congress to those who should enlist for and served to the close of the war.
