I certify that Captain Colin Cocke has been an officer in the Virginia continental line from January 1776 to this day. Given under my hand this 12th day of February 178 [last digit missing or illegible]

Know all men by these presents that I Colin Cocke of Prince George County and State of Virginia have this day appointed Thomas D Harris of the City of Richmond and State of Virginia my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name to ask demand and receive from the State of Virginia all the land that may be due me in consideration of my services as Captain & paymaster to the Second Regiment commanded by Colo. John Neville hereby ratifying and confirming all and whatever my said attorney shall or may do by Virtue of these presents – In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 19<sup>th</sup> June 1807

I do certify that I saw, Collin Cocke acting as Ensign in Capt. Tho's Ruffins [Thomas Ruffin's] company of the sixth Virginia Regiment on Continental Establishment about the first of March, seventeen hundred and and seventy six, and was appointed thereafter to the Rank of a Captain. Given under my hand this first May 1807.
