## Pension application of James Holt BLWt453-200 Transcribed by Will Graves

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

The will was dated March 8, 1804 and was executed in the presence of Susanna Marston, John Marks, John Newcum, Benjamin Bailey, Sally S Stewart, Charles Smith, Sally Smith, Max Miller, Rachel Craig, James Poyner.]

Richmond February 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1808

I certify that I was acquainted with James Holt, Deceased, in the Early part of 1777 as an officer in the 15<sup>th</sup> Virginia Continental Regiment, he was made a Prisoner at the Fall of Charlestown [probably the fall of Charleston South Carolina on May 12, 1780] & continued in service to the close of the war.

A Warrant for 2666 2/3 acres has issued to James Holt as a Lieutenant of the Continental line for 3 years service.
