I do certify that Captain Whitehead Coleman was appointed and commissioned an officer in the Virginia Continental Regiment of Artillery the 13<sup>th</sup> January one thousand seven hundred seventy seven and that he continued in service till the first January 1783 at which time he retired for want of a command given under my hand this 15<sup>th</sup> day of May 1783. P Muhlenberg BG [Peter Muhlenberg, Brigadier General]

I do certify that the within named Whitehead Coleman was appointed an Ensign in Colo. Wm. Dangerfields [sic: William Daingerfield's] Regiment being the 7<sup>th</sup> Va Continental Regt about April 1776 that he continued therein until Colo. [Charles] Harrisons Regiment of artilery was raised which I think was some time in the Winter 1776 or Spring of 1777 and that he was then appointed Captain Lieutenant in s'd Harrisons Regiment. He was afterwards promoted to a Captaincy & continued in service until the close of the War.

I do Certify that Capt. Whitehead Coleman was appointed an officer in Colo. Harrisons Reg't. of in the Spring or summer 1776 and continued in sevce until I was taken prisoner & I have alway understood continued in service till the close of the war July 26<sup>th</sup> 1799–
