Personally came before me a justice of the peace in and for the county aforesaid, Jacob Springer, and being sworn according to law doth depose and say that hethe said Jacob Springer was a Lieutenant of the Thirteenth Virginia Regiment of the Revolutionary army of the United States and that he knew Patrick Finnigin and Phillip Henthorn soldiers of the said regiment. That they were under his command during part of the war and did actually serve until the end of it.

Sworn and subscribed before me this fourth day of April Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and eleven.
