Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

William Halbert Dragoon Lee's Legion

Warrant issued under date the 22nd January 1813 and to the Honorable Ant. New [Anthony New], M. C. [Member of Congress] 13th February 1813

I hereby constitute & appoint Colonel Anthony Knew my Attorney to draw & grant a receipt in my name for the land warrant due to me for my services during the revolutionary War; & also to receive for me any depreciation money that may be due to me on the same account. The length of time during which I served was 7 years, within a few months, which fact can be proven by General Henry Lee, under whom I served. Witness my hand & seal this 7th day of January 1813. Witness

He is the person in whose favor I have seen a certificate signed by General Henry Lee, certifying that the said Halbert served under him during the revolutionary War, which fact I have also heard stated by various other persons.
