his name appears on a list of applicants for invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of Georgia submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on March to, 1795 and printed in the American State Papers class 9, page 169

Rank: Private

Regiment; Colonel James Jackson's Georgia light dragoons

Disability; Wounded in his left thigh, and left arm by a broad sword When and where disabled; July 6, 1781, near Long Cane Mills

Residence; Columbia County

Remarks; Knows muster-rolls in the office of the Georgia line, for the year 1781.

Evidence complete, excepting that the examining physicians do not state the degree of his

disability.

[Facts in file: veteran allowed a pension from September 4, 1794; veteran died in Georgia in 1805; there is no family data in this file.]
