## Georgia Walton [County]

Personally came David Smith before me Ledford Mobley an acting Justice of the Peace for said County & being duly sworn in terms of the law deposeth & saith on oath that Benjamin Smith was a revolutionary Soldier & was attached to the American Army against Great Britain and the Indians: -- and was in three skirmishes (to wit) against the Tories one skirmish at the Siege of Ninety Six; one skirmish in Laurens District South Carolina on Horse Creek also one skirmish in Abbeville District South Carolina on Saluda [River] at the Cedar Island. And this Deponent further saith that the said Benjamin Smith was a soldier under General Williamson when he said Williamson went against the Cherokee Indians.
