Pension Application of John H. Camp R13000 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

NOTES:

There is no description of the service of John H. Camp in this file.

On 25 Sep 1832 in Giles County TN, James W. Camp and Dorothy C. Camp, guardians of the minor heirs of John H. Camp, assigned power of attorney to obtain from Virginia or the United States any benefits, presumably for service by John H. Camp, under an act of Congress said to have been passed on 30 May 1830.

The file contains a copy of the last will and testament of John Camp, probated on 17 May 1820, with the following provisions:

Previous gifts, loans, etc. to sons John H. Camp and James W. Camp confirmed.

To wife Martha Camp negro Sucky and her children Nelly, Maria, Mehaly, Sophia, Roland, and Polly; the loan of Isaac, his wife Silvey Jincy and her child William; three mules named Dick, Ned, and Jim, as well as other stock; and furniture.

A document dated Feb 1833 certifies that the following were heirs of John Camp: James W. Camp; Martha Flournoy, wife of William C. Flournoy; Maria W. Yerger, wife of Albert Yerger; Elizabeth W. Camp; Sarah I. Camp; Mary Ann Camp; James T. Camp.
