Pension Application of Samuel Carey R13010

VA Half Pay

Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris. Revised 28 November 2023.

The United States, Dr.

To Samuel Carey a supernumerary Lieutenant in the Second State Regiment in the Virginia Line (commanded by Colonel William Brent [VAS2639]) in the Revolutionary War.

For his half pay, from 6<sup>th</sup> February, 1781, (day after reduction of State Troops) to 4 Nov'r. 1805 [date of death],

in pursuance of the third section of an Act of Congress "to provide for liquidating and paying certain claims of the State of Virginia," approved 5<sup>th</sup> July, 1832, being 24 years 272 days at £48 Virginia Currency, equal to \$106 per annum; amounting to dollars, 3959 23/100

Cary, administrator de bonis non of the estate of Samuel Cary, granted power of attorney to receive half pay for the services of Samuel Cary as lieutenant, lieutenant and adjutant, or adjutant. In addition to half pay for service as a lieutenant, additional pay was granted for service as an adjutant.]
