On this 5 Day of October 1846 personally appeared before me Joel Cannon one of the acting Justices of the peace in and for said District, Sarah Burnett, a resident of South Carolina in Spartenburgh District, aged 83 years, who being first Duly sworn according to law, Doath on her oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, passed July 7th 1838 entitled, an act granting half pay and pensions to certian widows – that she is the widow of John Burnett, who was a private Soldier of the Infantry in the state of Virginia in the war of the Revolution in Col. Gibsons Regiment, and as such served in united states against the Common anemy for the turm of Eighteen months that he was a resident of Mecklenburg County when he entred the service in the State of Virginia. that he entred the service about the year 1779. She further Decalares, that she was married to the said John Burnett sumtime in the year 1780 and that her husband the aforesaid John Burnett Died on the 22^d Day of May 1809. that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service but the marriage took place previous to the first of January seventeen hundred and ninety four viz. at the time above stated – octe[?]
