Madison County, Georgia, 4<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1833, Isaac Busby, aged 77 years:

“He entered as an enlisted soldier under Captain \_\_\_ Pope in the army of the United States in the year \_\_\_ and served in the (regiment not recollected), but commanded by Colonel Taylor, the whole under the command of General Green [sic, Nathanael Greene]. He resided about thirty five miles above Columbia, SC, but does not recollect the District -- he was in the battle of Stono commanded by General Greene and at the battle of Eutaw Springs -- when he first enlisted he was marched to Charlestown South Carolina he was marched to the battles before stated he served three years under this term of enlistment but from old age and the loss of memory he cannot recollect the year he enlisted nor the year he was discharged but refers you to these two battles to show the time of his services --”
