State of South Carolina County of Ocony [Oconee] formerly Pickens District: SS

On this first day of August 1871, personally appeared before me, a clerk of a Court of Record in and for the County and State aforesaid Mary Quarles a resident of \_\_ in the County of Ocony and State of South Carolina aged 80 years, who being duly sworn makes the following declaration, in order to obtain the Pension provided by the Act of Congress approved July 14, 1862 February 3, 1853 & July 27 1848. That she is the widow of David Quarles, who was a private in Company commanded by Captain Latham (she thinks) in the \_\_Regiment of \_\_ in the Revolutionary War of 1861; that her maiden name was Mary Billingsley and that she was married to said David Quarles on or about the 7th day of December 1831, at \_\_ in the District of Pickens South Carolina and State of South Carolina by Reverend Noel Hide and that she knows of no record evidence of said marriage.

She further declares that said David Quarles her husband, died in the service of the United States as aforesaid at in Pickens District in the State of South Carolina on or about the 19th day of February 1845, of old age. She also declares that she has remained a widow ever since the death of said David Quarles, and that she has not in any manner engaged in, aided or abetted, the rebellion in the United States; and she hereby appoints RW Walker of Washington DC as her lawful Attorney, with power of substitution, and authorizes him to present and prosecute this claim, and to receive her pension certificate.
